

Synopsis

I just finished this book and I loved it. This is a Holocaust story told from the perspective of two young Jewish brothers in Berlin, who with their family and help from good German people, were hidden and taken care of during the war. At war's end, the only survivors were the two boys, and their story of survival during and after the war, and how they came to America is really a fascinating saga. This is a must read for anyone interested in the Holocaust era, and should be required reading in every school.

This book is essentially an autobiography told by a Holocaust survivor. (I've met the subject of the book in person, and he is truly an interesting character and nice man). This is not a scholarly Holocaust book, so do not come to it looking for an overview of the war or Holocaust experiences -- there are many such books and such authors. Instead, this is a personal story told by a survivor. It traces the life of two brothers who managed to survive the war in Berlin, sheltered in part by SS members. It talks about the life of his parents, his early childhood, and how he escaped death many times. It is a highly personal story. The ghost writer isn't fantastic, and there is a certain amount of sugar coating as one might expect. As such, it doesn't have the literary impact of Primo Levi, or the overall impact of a book such as Good Old Days or those by Jan Gross. But still, it is a personal story told by a survivor, and as their numbers dwindle it is important to understand the experiences they went through.

I found Saved by the Enemy a well written book for either a younger reader or an adult. While never watering down the Nazi Regime, Mr. Ledbetter balances that with the kindness of several German citizens. This is a story that must be told. It is also a story of achieving the American Dream. I don't

want to spoil the ending, but one simply must congratulate both men for their hard work and subsequent success.

What an inspirational story! The whole book was captivating. I had relatives that lived in Germany during WWII but never heard much. What the boys did was incredible!

Wow! I learned more about Hitler and his rise to power from this book than any history book in school. The subtle way in which Hitler began to take away the freedom of the "non Aryan" is to be studied and noted by all so that it can never happen again. The will to survive by these brothers is amazing. Their story will make you cry but mostly give you hope. I highly recommend reading this then going to a holocaust museum and watch the rest of history unfold.
